

# RESPONSIBLE MINERALS POLICY

## Purpose | Applicability

This Responsible Minerals Policy (Policy) applies worldwide to NVIDIA and its suppliers (Covered Suppliers) that provide materials that contain gold, tantalum, tungsten, tin, cobalt, and any additional minerals as communicated by NVIDIA to its suppliers (together, Covered Minerals). NVIDIA does not directly procure minerals.

## Policy Statement | Our Standards

NVIDIA is committed to the responsible sourcing of Covered Minerals for our products. Our goal is to prevent Covered Minerals in our supply chain from being sourced from Conflict-Affected and High-risk Areas (CAHRAs) in a manner that directly or indirectly contributes to conflict or severe human rights violations. NVIDIA has established supply chain diligence and management systems consistent with the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development's Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from CAHRAs (OECD Guidance), and we require the same of Covered Suppliers. We also work with Covered Suppliers to remove high-risk and non-conformant smelters and refiners from our supply chain where appropriate.

## Our Expectations of Suppliers

As part of NVIDIA's responsible supply chain practices, we commit to, and expect Covered Suppliers to follow, the standards set out in the [Responsible Business Alliance \(RBA\) Code of Conduct](#), this Policy, and applicable laws. NVIDIA expects its Covered Suppliers to:

- Establish and maintain a responsible minerals sourcing policy and a due diligence and management system consistent with OECD Guidance;
- Source tin, tantalum, tungsten, and gold from conformant or active smelters or refiners that have been validated through third-party accredited audits conducted by organizations such as the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI), the London Bullion Market Association, the Responsible Jewellery Council, and the Tungsten Industry-Conflict Minerals Council (Conformant or Active Smelters) and work to increase the percentage of other Covered Minerals sourced from Conformant or Active Smelters;
- Provide due diligence and chain of custody information to NVIDIA upon request;
- Implement corrective actions when requested by NVIDIA;
- Provide an accessible company grievance mechanism that workers, their representatives, and other stakeholders can use to raise grievances without fear of reprisal or retaliation;
- To the extent permitted by law, promptly notify NVIDIA of any substantiated concern regarding issues governed by this Policy, and cooperate with any subsequent inquiries from NVIDIA;
- Participate in capability-building efforts around responsible minerals sourcing; and
- Extend the expectations contained in this Policy to their own suppliers.

NVIDIA will assess and may discontinue, temporarily suspend, and/or withhold future business from suppliers who do not comply with this Policy.

## Speak Up | Reporting Concerns

We are committed to facilitating access to effective justice and remedy. Anyone, including workers, suppliers, and other external stakeholders, can confidentially and anonymously report human rights concerns or Policy violations using NVIDIA's [corporate hotline](#) which is hosted by an independent third party. We will promptly investigate allegations of human rights violations or violations of this Policy.

We will not retaliate and do not tolerate retaliation against anyone, including human rights defenders, for making a complaint in good faith, bringing a potential violation to the attention of management, or participating or assisting in an investigation. We expect our suppliers to uphold these principles.
